The Mayor and two City Council seats are up for election. Voters of the entire city will elect the Mayor. Two district seats are up for election on November 8: District 1 and District 4. Registered voters in these two districts will vote for their district representatives.





New Coffee Shops Add to Downtown Scene



The Rancho Vista - Airbnb, downtown Vista

Two new coffee shops are making their homes in Vista and growing the downtown's coffee scene. Steel Mill Coffee and soon-to-be opened Archer's Arrow are bringing new flavor notes to the blooming coffee culture, along with Brewed Vista, known for its gourmet coffee and craft beers. All three caffeinated shops and roasters are located on Main Street.

For both Steel Mill Coffee and Archer's Arrow, there's an excitement to breaking ground in the Vista coffee scene. "Being a part of creating the scene in Vista is an honorable thing, especially along Main Street, which is developing into the coolest place you can be," said Shea Cooper, co-founder of Steel Mill Coffee with Chris Balingit and Riley Hawk.

"A high tide raises all ships," said Josh Barille, co-owner of Archer's Arrow with wife Kat. "It's better to have a cool coffee scene than it is to have a cool coffee shop. The fact that we're on the same street as Steel Mill Coffee is good for Vista and good for us both. It's bigger than us. It's a cool thing to be a part of."

Not far down the road on S. Santa Fe Avenue between Civic Center and Vista Village is a new short-term rental – The Rancho Vista – Airbnb, providing workspace for traveling businesses and accommodations for out-of-town guests, all with easy access to Vista's thriving downtown and coffee scene.

Keeping Downtown Welcoming for Everyone

Community ambassadors are working to enhance the safety, cleanliness, and welcoming nature of Vista's downtown for residents and businesses. Launched this past May, the team of Clean and Safe ambassadors are connecting with local businesses, giving directions, providing restaurant and retail information, picking up litter and logging maintenance requests requiring the City's attention, and

offering other customer-oriented support to make downtown Vista more inviting for everyone.

"When an area is well taken care of, it looks more inviting, and crime is deterred," said Block by Block Vice President Daniela Vasile, the company contracted to provide safety and light cleaning services to downtown. "From the sidewalk to the street, our team is there to make certain that things are clean and safe for the community to enjoy." The program is funded by money the City received through the federal American Rescue Plan Act stimulus bill and is currently funded for two years. The team of four ambassadors is available to the community Wednesdays through Sundays from 10 am to 10 pm. Along with this, four Vista Sheriff's deputies will begin patrolling downtown on bicycles to create a more visible presence for visitors and businesses. In November, four additional bicycle patrols will be added.

Emergencies Can Be Unpredictable

But you can get prepared with these basic steps

Emergencies can happen at any time and without warning, and with National Preparedness Month occurring in September, it's a good time to think about making a plan before disaster strikes. Disasters happen when we don't expect them and often when families are not together. Suddenly, you need to think about your kids at school or elderly parents. If phones don't work, or some neighborhoods aren't accessible, what will you do? Having a family emergency plan will save time and make real situations less stressful. Emergencies come in many shapes and forms, from wildfires to chemical spills to sustained power outages, so it is important to imagine the most likely emergency scenarios.

Sit with your family and talk openly about the types of potential emergencies that could occur. Locally, we are more likely to face a wildfire or earthquake than some other natural disaster. After discussing the possible threats, create a plan for dealing with a large-scale emergency. The plan should be straightforward and easy to implement. Complex plans are too difficult to implement during the stressful moments of an emergency. With a little preparation, you can be ready for anything.

Plan for scenarios that may force you to:

- Evacuate your home. Have a "go" kit ready to take with you that includes basic items and whatever unique needs your family might have.
- Shelter at home. Be stocked up with essential foods, water, medicines, and other items needed to survive.

Be prepared. Not scared.

- Know the risks.
- Make an emergency plan.
- Build an emergency kit for at least 72 hrs.
- Sign up for emergency alerts.

Changing Lives Through Affordable Housing

Through the City of Vista's Homeless Outreach Team, social workers, a housing navigator, and other social service providers and public agencies, hundreds of individuals and their families have already been helped through a major expansion of outreach, emergency shelter, supportive housing, and mental health services. Get to know some of the people whose lives have been transformed by the City's homeless outreach program and services.



A Fresh Start for Maybell and Cooper

Maybell (70) and son Cooper (32) were living in their vehicle for over a year after their rental house was sold before the City's homeless outreach team began working with the family. Last November, the family received an Emergency Housing voucher and were placed in a motel temporarily as city social workers teamed with local agencies to locate an apartment. The City's Housing Navigator secured a one-bedroom apartment this spring and mother and son moved into their new home in June. Through coordination and partnerships with the local agencies, Maybell and Cooper were assisted with furnishing their new apartment and are happy to have a permanent home, once again.

A Stable Home for Jacqueline and Carlos

Last winter, after living outside for an extended time, Jacqueline (70) and Carlos (53) called the City's Homeless Outreach team requesting assistance. The City's social workers met the couple and secured a federal housing voucher and they were then placed in temporary housing through the City's motel voucher program. After an extensive apartment search and multiple application submissions, the City Housing Navigator secured a onebedroom apartment in Vista. On April 18, the couple moved into their new apartment which was furnished through North County Lifeline's Homeless Prevention Program. The newly housed residents are experiencing their first summer in their new home and are making plans for their future.

State Funds Allocated for Vista Projects

Two previously unfunded projects on the City's Capital Improvement Project list have received funding from the State of California's General Fund. Assemblymember Tasha Boerner Horvath recently notified the City that the appropriations for two of four projects submitted to her office have received acceptance in the state's budget. The funds will be used to enhance Vista's community and public facilities. The details of the projects will be worked out in the coming months.

\$1.6 million - Luz Duran Park Community Center. The existing Sheriff's substation will be converted into a community center, and the substation will be relocated to city-owned property at 986 Vista Village Drive.

\$1.4 million - Establish electric vehicle charging stations in and around the city.

Protect your car from theft. Thieves have gotten increasingly savvy. Be vigilant about securing your car and take preventative measures to keep your car safe.

Never Leave:

- Keys visible or in ignition.
- · Windows open, doors unlocked.
- Cash, change, purse, bags.
- Construction tools, garage opener.
- Cell phones, chargers, CDs, GPS.
- Mail, documents with personal information.
- Other valuables.

Keep it Neat. Shut the Lid.

- Close lids to prevent trash/recyclables from blowing out of bins.
- Keep area around bins clean, free of trash, debris, & liquids.
- Don't overfill bins.
- If container is damaged or leaking, call EDCO for a replacement.
- Clean bins by hand, broom, or dry mop.
- Maintain area around bins to keep odor and rodents away.





Back-To-School Safe Driving Tips

Kids in school buses, children on foot and bikes, parents in cars: back-to-school days bring congestion and an increase in potential hazards. A few key reminders for drivers to be aware of can help improve safety for everyone.

- Slow down and drive extra cautiously.
- Don't load or unload children across the street from school.
- Don't double park; it blocks visibility for other children and vehicles.
- When flashing lights are blinking, stop and yield to pedestrians crossing the crosswalk or intersection.
- Be prepared for kids to appear in unexpected places, like from between parked cars; if they're on bikes, prepare for them to turn in front of you without looking or signaling.






