Mayor Set to Retire After 24 Years of Public Service



Mayor Judy Ritter is retiring after 24 years on the City Council. The mayor will hand in her gavel after the City Council meeting on Tuesday, December 13.

Judy Ritter moved to Vista in 1970 from Michigan and raised her three daughters who all graduated from Vista High School. Entering local office as a city council member in 1998, Mayor Ritter then took the reins as mayor in 2010, and began building upon Vista's accomplishments and planning for the future.

Since then, Vista welcomed its first upscale hotel, the Marriott Town Suites, and then added the Hyatt Place and Ayers Hotel. Two other hotels, the Hilton Garden Inn and Marriott Courtyard, are in the planning stages. To Vista residents, the additional tax revenue from these thriving businesses means more amenities and choices, and to some visitors, they even end up proudly making Vista their new home!

During the mayor's earlier terms of office, the Paseo Santa Fe corridor was a vision in the making for over 20 years, and now, the corridor is established and creating other downtown uses which are benefitting local businesses and the community. Under Judy Ritter's helm, economic development was a top priority and Vista became a major player in the economic landscape of North County.

"It has been a life-changing opportunity and a monumental journey over the past 24 years," said Mayor Ritter. "I have spent over two decades working with six different city councils in building upon our city's accomplishments and planning for the future. What an honor it has been for me!"

In almost a quarter of a century of service, Mayor Ritter has made many friends and has initiated positive change in Vista. She plans to remain active, engaged, and committed to making the Vista community better.

"My goal was to help improve our community when I first became a city council member in 1998, and to leave the city a better place when I took the reins as mayor in 2010," observed Mayor Ritter. "I hope I have accomplished that objective."

Litter & Improvement Teams Beautify Vista

Vista's community improvement team continues to remove trash citywide. An additional crew was recently added to the team of people collecting trash along city roads. The city contracts with Pride Industries to keep the roadways clean and beautiful. Pride employs people with disabilities or other barriers to employment and the litter crews clean over 29 streets a month, walking 27 miles. During the past nine months, PRIDE crews picked up 915 bags of litter and 313 bags of recyclables.

A new community improvement team has been created to focus on collecting abandoned shopping carts throughout the city and cleaning trash and debris from encampments. The goal of the litter crews and community improvement team is to enhance the quality of life for residents by keeping the city clean and beautiful.

Are you ready for rain?

Help keep pollutants out of rainwater that flows to our local creeks:

- Pick up pet waste or loose trash and debris.
- Avoid applying pesticides and fertilizers prior to rainfall.
- Maintain vehicles to prevent oil and anti freeze leaks.
- Inspect roof gutters and area drains, remove debris as needed.
- Wait 48 hours after rainfall to irrigate.
- Install plants or mulch on exposed soil to prevent erosion.

Protecting water quality and preventing stormwater pollution is a community effort.

Pala Vista Park Taking Shape

Construction on the one-acre lot located on the corner of Civic Center Drive, north of Highway 78, is taking shape as crews build Vista's newest park. The utility companies placed overhead utility wires underground and now, the construction is moving forward at a faster pace. Some amenities featured in the future green space include two children's playgrounds with inclusive elements, shade sails, a tree-climbing structure, and natural turf space. Once completed, the park will be surrounded by decorative security fencing. One of the unique features in the park's design is the placement of a kite sculpture, which will be selected by the Public Arts Commission and approved by the City Council. The construction of the park is scheduled to be completed by spring 2023.

City's Grant Program Impacts Lives

The city's federal Community Development Block Grant is used to fund a wide range of unique community programs and services to ensure Vista has resources for affordable housing, a suitable living environment, and economic opportunity. One such program making a difference in the community is the Vista Community Clinic's Project REACH Step UP mentoring program, an after-school program for high school students. The young adults learn respect, dignity, and self-confidence to help in making better decisions.

One senior, Angel, is reaching academic success with what he has learned in the program. After coming back from quarantine in 2021, Angel struggled academically with school and with some of his assignments. Project REACH impacted his life both academically and emotionally by providing resources for his family and for him. Now, when

Angel is not in class or working after school, he likes to attend REACH, where he is able to finish his homework, study, and interact with his peers. Angel has become a role model toward his peers and provides advice on what to do to succeed in high school. Apart from REACH and academic successes, Angel plays basketball, works out, and likes video games. After graduation, Angel plans to become a fitness trainer and help others live a healthier lifestyle.


New Downtown Apartments Focus on Art & Affordability

Paseo Artist Village, a new apartment development downtown, recently opened and is unique in that it focuses on art and affordability. The development provides continued sustainable and affordable housing for residents, artists, and veterans in Vista.

Through a partnership with Community HousingWorks, the City leveraged its affordable housing funds and provided the land for 97 years, which enabled the project to come to fruition. Community HousingWorks is a nonprofit organization that develops affordable apartment communities and Paseo Artist Village is the only property the organization built that is art focused.

Paseo Artist Village offers 60 affordable units, an art gallery, a community room, and resources for residents. Applications were open to local artists, veterans, seniors, and their families. In early 2023, a Jimmy John's gourmet deli will open in the first-floor retail space of the building.

Over the last ten years, the city has invested in four affordable housing developments and worked with developers to maintain affordable covenants for three other affordable housing developments, providing 471 individuals and families with the ability to invest in other life necessities, such as education, healthier groceries, and health care.

Be Fire-Safe While Decking the Halls

As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire-smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly and these types of fires are more likely to be serious.

Carefully decorating your home can help make your holidays safe. Here are some tips:

- Only use flame-retardant decorations.
- Check holiday lights for frayed wires or excessive wear.
- Don't link more than three strands of lights.
- Never leave a burning candle unattended. Consider battery-operated candles.
- Keep your live Christmas tree away from heat sources and room exits.
- Water live Christmas trees daily to keep them from becoming dry.



Christmas Tree Recycling

EDCO customers may place Christmas trees curbside on their regular collection day beginning December 26 through January 6 at no extra charge. All trees must be cut to four feet or less in length when placed curbside. Trimmings, including tinsel and the tree stand, must be removed. Organic decorations, such as natural garland and wreaths, can also be placed in the residential designated yard waste container. Trees placed inside the yard waste containers must be cut to fit into the yard waste cart with no trees sticking up or out of the yard waste cart.

Grant Awarded for Safe Parking Program

A County of San Diego grant for \$65,000 will help the City of Vista fund a safe parking program to provide parking spaces for community members experiencing homelessness. The space will serve as a place to safely park vehicles or RVs for the night. The City anticipates opening the 25-vehicle safe parking lot by spring 2023.

The site will operate seven days a week and visitors will be provided with case management and housing navigation services, along with onsite restrooms, showers, and other basic amenities. The pet-friendly site will focus on individuals, families, and people escaping domestic violence. The city has committed \$250,000 for two years of operations.

Earlier this year, the County Board of Supervisors created a \$10 million grant program available to cities throughout the county to help people experiencing homelessness. Vista, Oceanside, and San Diego are the first recipients of the grants to address the homelessness crisis in the region.

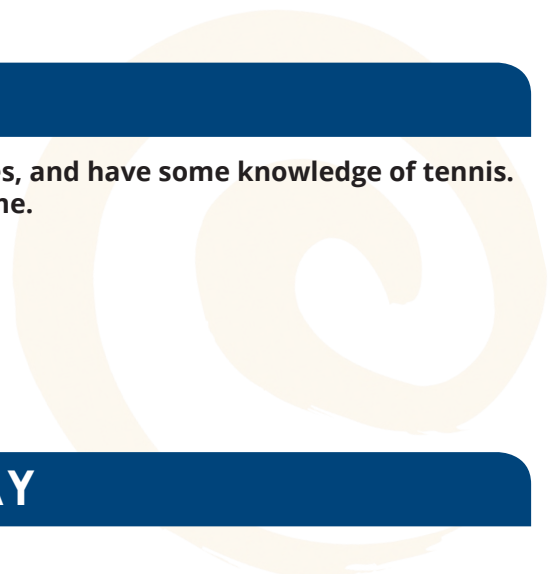

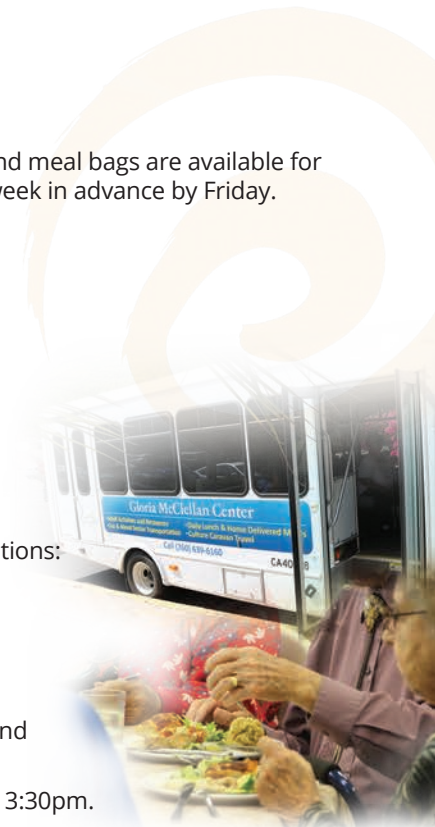

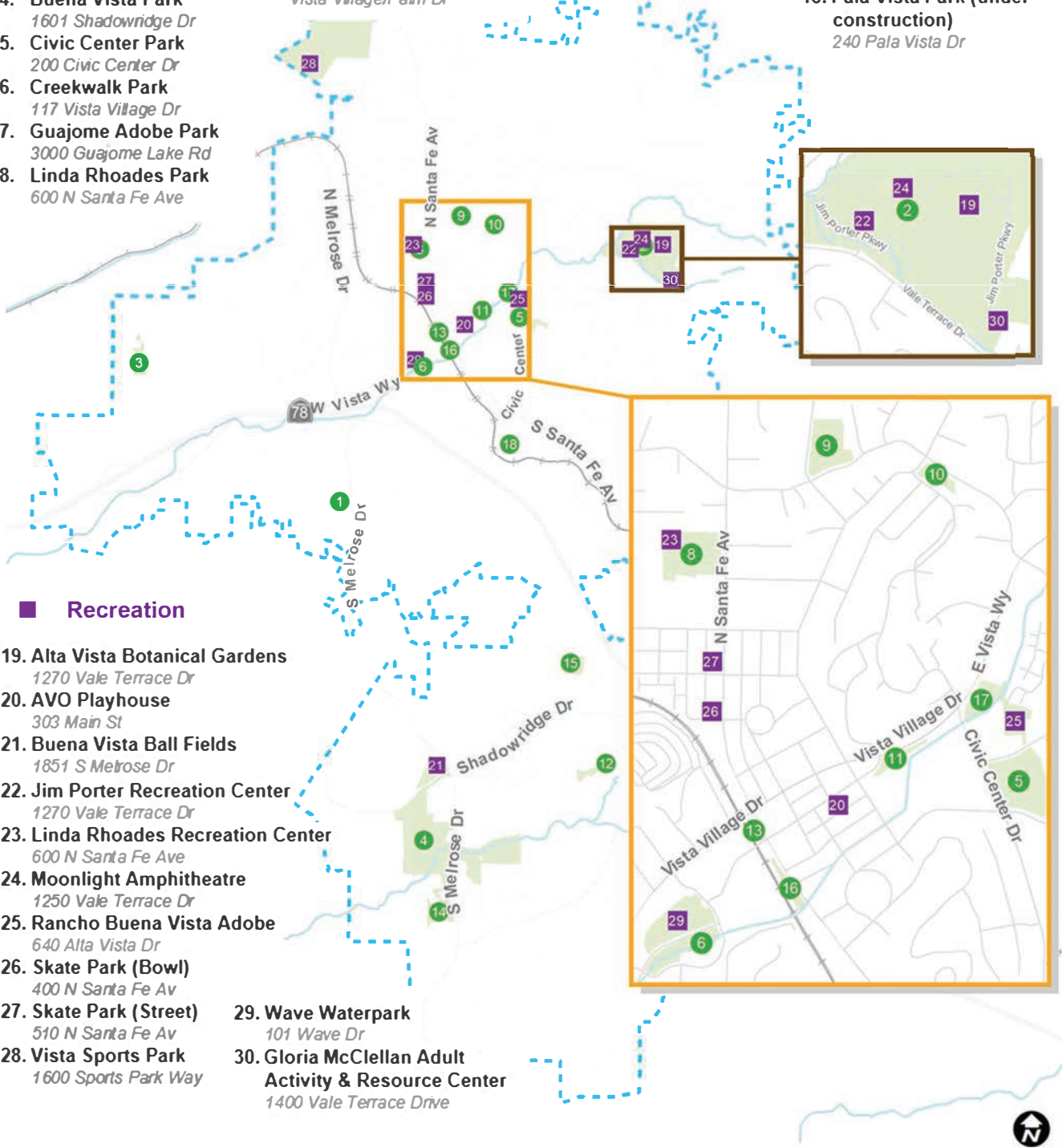
