### CHILD DEVELOPMENT

At this age, they should be able to follow directions and understand how to stay safe. Children ages 6 to 10 are more independent and physically active than they were in the preschool years. They also are more involved with friends and are learning to think in more complex ways. As their cognitive abilities advance, children in this age range can solve more complex problems and begin to think more critically. Kids in this stage are developing their social skills, such as making and maintaining friendships, trying to resolve conflicts, and expressing empathy.
