## Buena Creek Navigation Center: A Beacon of Hope for Vista's Homeless



In a landmark development addressing homelessness in Vista, the Buena Creek Navigation Center officially opened its doors on March 4, 2024, becoming the first Cityowned and managed homeless shelter. This facility, located just outside of Vista city limits near the Buena Creek Sprinter Station, marks a significant milestone in the City's ongoing efforts to provide support and resources to individuals experiencing homelessness.

The Buena Creek Navigation Center's inauguration signifies more than just the

unveiling of a building; it represents a collaborative effort between the City of Vista, the City of Encinitas, and the State of California. The City of Vista's operations for the center are secured for the next three years, thanks to a generous \$5 million earmark from the State of California, facilitated by Senator Catherine Blakespear.


The center, managed by the Vista-based nonprofit organization Retread and overseen by the City's Housing and Homeless Services division, offers a range of services to help people achieve housing stability and self-sufficiency. This interim supportive housing project offers 48 beds, with 36 allocated for Vista and 12 for Encinitas.

As the Buena Creek Navigation Center embarks on its journey of service and support, it stands as a testament to the power of the community coming together to make a positive impact in the lives of others.

## **Vista Launches Emergency Housing Assistance Program for Vista Residents**



In response to the pressing economic challenges faced by families and individuals in Vista, the City of Vista has initiated the Vista Emergency Housing Assistance Program (VEHAP). This innovative program aims to provide vital support to those economically impacted and at risk of homelessness.

With a focus on housing retention, self-sufficiency, and stabilization, VEHAP offers help for individuals and families struggling to maintain housing stability. The program targets Vista households that make 65% or less of the median area income, ensuring assistance reaches those who need it most.

VEHAP's primary objective is to provide financial aid and housing stability to

vulnerable households on the brink of displacement. With awards capped at \$10,000 and six months per household, the program ensures assistance is both impactful and sustainable. Moreover, funds will be disbursed directly to landlords, property managers, mortgage servicers, utilities, or other service providers, guaranteeing that aid goes directly toward housing security.

Administered by the non-profit organization MAAC on behalf of the City of Vista, VEHAP represents a collaborative effort to comprehensively address homelessness and housing insecurity. By leveraging community resources and expertise, the program strives to make a tangible difference in the lives of Vista residents facing economic hardship.

The launch of VEHAP signals a significant step forward in Vista's ongoing efforts to combat homelessness and promote housing stability. As the program rolls out, it stands poised to make a meaningful impact on the lives of countless individuals and families, offering a lifeline in their time of need.

## City Council Allocates Excess Revenues to **Enhance Community Programs and Services**

The City of Vista continues to enhance community well-being and safety by allocating excess general funds and cannabis tax revenues. With a clear vision for community enhancement, the City Council has approved a comprehensive list of projects and programs to be funded, promising a brighter future and improvements for Vista residents.

In a demonstration of proactive governance, the City Council has earmarked excess general fund revenues from the 2022/23 budget year, totaling \$15,187,586, for various initiatives. Among the notable allocations is \$4,500,000 designated for acquiring property earmarked for a future homeless shelter, reinforcing the City's dedication to addressing homelessness in Vista. The City Council has also directed that excess funds be used to pay for new infrastructure that will improve traffic safety including the installation of new traffic signals and speed humps, and construction of new roundabouts.

Furthermore, the City is investing in innovative programs to promote safety and sustainability, including implementing an e-bike safety training and rebate program. Additionally, expansion plans for the Kites Over Vista program will delight residents and visitors alike, fostering a sense of community and outdoor enjoyment.

Recognizing the importance of green spaces in urban environments, the City Council has allocated resources for the design and development of two new parkettes, which will provide residents with accessible and inviting recreational areas. Moreover, funding for youth organizations' travel expenses to national competitions reflects the City's commitment to supporting the achievements and aspirations of Vista's young talents.

Celebrating milestones within the community remains a priority, as evidenced by funding allocated for a special event commemorating the McClellan Senior Center's 50th anniversary. Additionally, investment in special events for downtown Vista promises to invigorate the local economy and cultural scene, fostering a vibrant and inclusive community atmosphere.

In tandem with general fund revenues, excess cannabis tax revenues totaling \$2,451,798 have been allocated to bolster various community programs and services. Notable beneficiaries include the City's youth scholarships program, community safety prevention education programs, and support for programs addressing domestic violence.

Furthermore, the City's safe parking program receives vital funding, providing a lifeline for individuals experiencing housing insecurity and vehicle dwelling.

As Vista continues to grow and evolve, the prudent allocation of excess revenues is a testament to the City's dedication to serving its residents and fostering a bright future for generations.

## Coming Soon: E-Bike Safety & Rebate Program



Get ready, Vista residents! An exciting e-bike safety and training program, approved by the City Council to promote sustainable transportation and rider safety, will be coming soon. There will be both virtual and in-person training sessions. Riders will be able to learn or brush up on essential e-bike safety guidelines and best practices. Plus, eligible attendees can look forward to rebate opportunities when they are finished with training. ## **Clean Energy Alliance Powers Vista**

The Clean Energy Alliance (CEA), the City of Vista's new partner in meeting its Climate Action Plan goals by reducing greenhouse gas emissions by providing cleaner energy options, arrived in Vista on April 1. CEA is Vista's new default energy provider for purchasing power, offering the community local control and renewable energy options at competitive rates. Vista residents and businesses received mailers in early February and early

March informing them about the transition to CEA service. Residents and businesses will receive two more mailers in early April and May.

On April 1, all Vista residents and businesses were enrolled at CEA's Clean Impact Plus level, receiving 50% renewable and 75% carbon-free energy. Customers can opt up for Green Impact (100% renewable energy) or opt down to Clean Impact (50% renewable energy). Customers may also opt out and remain with San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E) to provide their energy.

SDG&E will continue to deliver energy to CEA customers through SDG&E's transmission lines. CEA customers will also continue to receive a single bill from SDG&E.

CEA and the City of Vista will host an information session on Tuesday, April 9, from 3 to 5 p.m. in the Vista Civic Center's second-floor lobby at 200 Civic Center Drive. Afterwards, CEA will make a presentation at that night's City Council meeting at 5:30 pm. The public is encouraged to attend to get more information.

## Free Shred Event for Vista Residents

The City and EDCO will sponsor a FREE paper shredding, e-waste collection, and mulch event on Saturday, June 8, from 9 am until noon at the Vista Civic Center lower parking lot, 200 Civic Center Drive.

Shredding: Limit to 2 bankers' boxes (10" x 12" x 15") per household.

E-Waste: Acceptable items include computers, monitors, laptops, computer

components, printers, scanners, fax machines, radios, and cell phones.

Free mulch is available for Vista residents (while supplies last)! This is a self-serve, self-loading, and self-haul service, so please bring your own cans/bags, gloves, and shovel. There is a limit of 3 cans/bags per vehicle. If you plan to haul your mulch in an open truck or trailer, please remember to bring a tarp to cover the material.

Goodwill will also be on-site to accept donated reusable items. Please go to edcodisposal.com, under News & Events, for a list of items that Goodwill will not accept.

#### City of Vista Residential Free Tree Giveaway Program

Starting in late April 2024, the City of Vista will pilot a Residential Free Tree Giveaway Program. Vista residents will be eligible for a free tree they can plant at home! #### Polystyrene (Styrofoam) Ban for Food Providers

In 2021, the City of Vista approved an ordinance that bans food service providers (restaurants, cafés, and drive-throughs) from using and distributing Styrofoam products with prepared food to their customers. By law, all food service providers must switch to a non-polystyrene (Styrofoam) product like paper or a compostable option. Plastic is currently acceptable. ## City of Vista Empowers Youth with Scholarship Program



The program provides financial assistance for various youth activities and opportunities. It covers a wide range of offerings, including:

- Sports programs and classes offered by the City.
- Club memberships, such as the Boys and Girls Club.
- Camps and summer programs like the Wave Waterpark.
- Tutoring and test preparation classes.
- Sports, visual arts, performing arts, and job training programs.

The goal of the Youth Scholarship program is to remove financial barriers and promote inclusivity, enabling all children and youth to participate in these activities regardless of their financial situation.

To qualify, applicants must be under age 25, residents of Vista, and meet income eligibility criteria. The scholarship amounts can be substantial, with individuals eligible to receive up to \$1,000 in funding within a 12-month period. While multiple scholarships may be awarded to an individual, the dispersed total can be at most \$1,000 over the designated period.




