SUBJECT: FISCAL YEARS 2022/23 AND 2023/24 CAPITAL PROJECT BUDGET MID-CYCLE UPDATE

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt City Council Resolution No. 2023- , and Buena Sanitation District Resolution No. 2023- , amending the Capital Project Budget for Fiscal Years 2022/23 and 2023/24.

CORRELATION TO CITY COUNCIL GOALS: Fiscal Responsibility and Traffic: Continue to improve the flow of traffic for all forms of travel, reduce congestion, and improve our roads and sidewalks.

PRIOR ACTION: On June 28, 2022, adopted City Council Resolution 2022-108, and Buena Sanitation District Resolution No. 2022-17 approving the Six-Year Capital Improvement Program and FYs 2022/23 and 2023/24 Capital Project Budget and authorizing appropriations for Fiscal Years 2022/23 and 2023/24 Capital Projects (Vote: 4-0, Ritter absent (Ritter experienced technical difficulties)).

STATEMENT ON THE SUBJECT: The City's six-year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) is updated biannually to manage and plan for major acquisitions and/or construction of large capital assets such as land, buildings, infrastructure, and other public improvements. On June 28, 2022, the City Council adopted the Fiscal Years (FY) 2022/23 and 2023/24 Capital Project Budget, authorizing appropriation for two years. At the one-year mark staff has completed a mid-cycle review and recommends new appropriations in the amount of \$5,128,000 and reduced appropriations of \$1,459,875 as discussed below.

Proposed New Projects. There are seven new capital projects proposed for FY 2023/24 that account for \$5,128,000 of the new appropriations. One of the proposed new projects is in the Public Facilities category and six are in the Streets category as shown in the chart below. The CIP budget detail sheets for all seven new projects are included as Exhibit 3.

Ongoing Projects. In addition to appropriations of \$5,128,000 for new projects, staff recommend decreases of \$1,459,875 to three ongoing projects for a new revised budget total of \$21,896,443 for FY 2023/24. Changes include a decrease of \$80,396 for the Pedestrian Mobility Sidewalks project which is reflective of the reduced Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) allocation to the City and the amount programed for sidewalks in the CDBG annual action plan approved by Council on April 25, 2023. The other two changes are decreases of \$1,062,058 for Vista Sewer and \$317,421 for Buena Sanitation District for the Encina Wastewater Project based on the Draft Budget for the Encina Wastewater Authority.

Proposed decreases for all on-going projects are displayed in the following table.

Projects Completed in FY 2023/24. Staff is pleased to identify the following projects that were completed in FY 2023/24.

Public Facilities

- Public Works Building A Replacement (8315): Completed construction of a new 10,000 square foot building that houses the Public Works Administration, Streets, Parks and Facility Maintenance Divisions. The Project included the installation of solar panels which is anticipated to produce an 85 percent or greater offset to the cost of power for the Public Works yard.
- WiFi at Luz Duran Park (8911): Installed fiber optic cabling for the installation of Vista Unified School District WiFi at Luz Duran Park utilizing ARPA funding.

Parks & Recreation

- Skate Park B Shade Structure (8337): Constructed a shade structure at Skate Park B, located at the corner of N. Santa Fe Avenue and W. Connecticut Avenue.
- Vista Sports Park Turf Replacement (8342): Replaced 185,000 square feet of turf on both soccer fields and the practice field.

Streets

- Street Maintenance and Slurry Seal (8262): Slurry sealed approximately 12 lane miles of the most deteriorated City streets, including certain streets that have carried a significant amount of traffic, such as N. Melrose Drive from the northern City boundary to W. Vista Way.
- Residential Street Rehabilitation (8313): Slurry sealed 132 of the most deteriorated residential streets located in Zone 1 and Zone 5, consisting of approximately 61 lane miles.
- Pedestrian Mobility Sidewalks (8290): Installed 1,955 linear feet of new sidewalks where sections of sidewalks did not previously exist, such as on W. California Avenue, Highland Drive, W. Orange

Avenue, Grapevine Road, NCTD Transit Station, and N. Melrose Drive, including the installation 7 new curb ADA compliant curb ramps.

Vista Sewer

- VC 11-15 Vista/Carlsbad Interceptor & Agua Hedionda Pump Station Replacement (8125): Joint project with the City of Carlsbad that replaced the Agua Hedionda Pump Station, gravity sewer trestle bridge.
- Eucalyptus & Citrus Avenue Sewer Capacity Improvements (8308): Upsized and replaced approximately 1,379 linear feet of sewer pipe along Eucalyptus Avenue and Citrus Avenue.

Buena Sewer

 Smilax and Mimosa Sewer Improvements (8301): Addressed capacity deficient sewer mains located in the County of San Diego and City of San Marcos in the vicinity of Smilax Road and Mimosa Road by constructing approximately 1,250 liner feet of sewer main and replacing various existing sewer pipeline segments.

FISCAL IMPACT: As noted in the "TOTALS" row below, revised appropriations for FY 2023/24 are \$21,896,443, a \$3,668,125 increase from the original budget adoption. Exhibit 4 provides proposed appropriation detail by project; the proposed changes by category for FY 2023/24 Capital Project Budget are as follows.

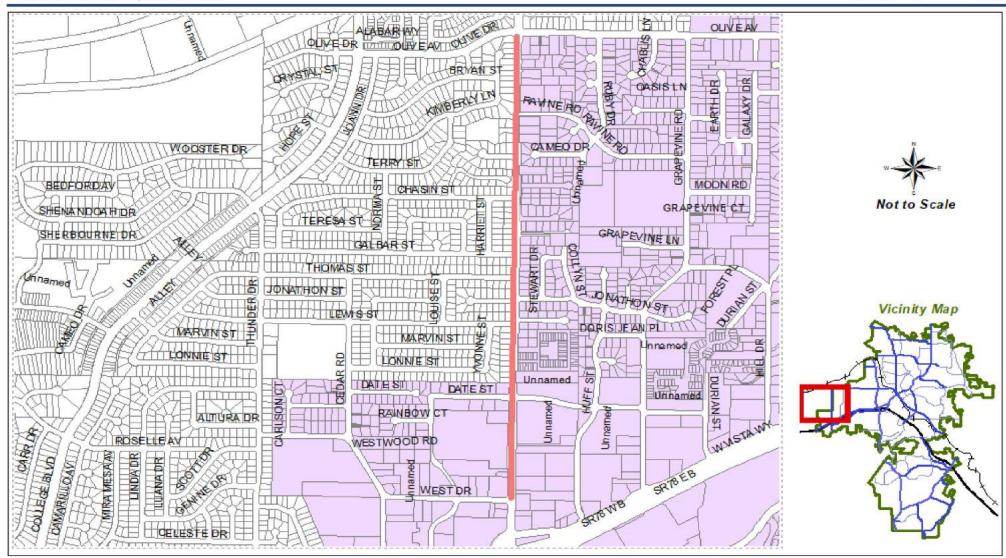

DESCRIPTION

Emerald Drive is a regional connector road that divides two neighborhoods because access across this street is made extremely difficult by large amounts of traffic traveling at high speeds. This also results in many serious accidents. City staff, with the assistance of a consultant and extensive community engagement, developed a complete streets plan for Emerald Drive between Olive Avenue and West Drive. The plan proposes to transform the street into a calmed, pedestrian and bicycle friendly street by implementing roundabouts, pedestrian crossings, sidewalks and new striping. The total project cost is \$7 million and the project has been recommended for earmark funding in the amount of \$5 million by U.S. Representative Mike Levin. The City funding allocation in this fiscal year will cover the design of the project and a portion of the shortage in the project total cost.

STATUS

The design phase is anticipated to be completed in mid 2024.

IMPACT ON OPERATING BUDGET

Approximately \$5,000 in annual maintenance costs.

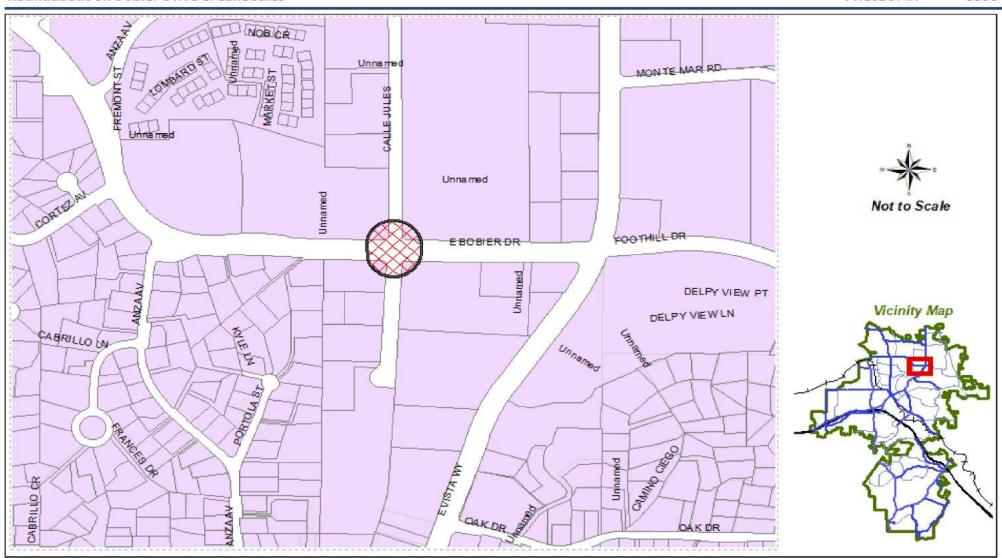

DESCRIPTION

Bicycling can be a clean and convenient alternative mode of transportation, which helps to alleviate motor vehicle congestion and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. However, existing bicycle facilities are often in need of improvements and gaps in the bicycle network prevent connectivity. Enhancing the existing bicycle network and facilities serves to accommodate the varying levels of user skills and to make bicycling a viable transportation option. This project will provide a funding source to assess existing conditions of the bicycle network and to develop improvement concepts and cost estimates. The recommended improvements for various streets will be prioritized and improvements will be implemented as funding becomes available.

STATUS

Staff will evaluate N. Melrose Drive, Hacienda Drive, N. Santa Fe Avenue north of Bobier Drive and Sycamore Avenue south of SR-78 for bicycle mobility improvements. Conceptual drawings and cost estimates will be developed and the streets will be prioritized for implementation.

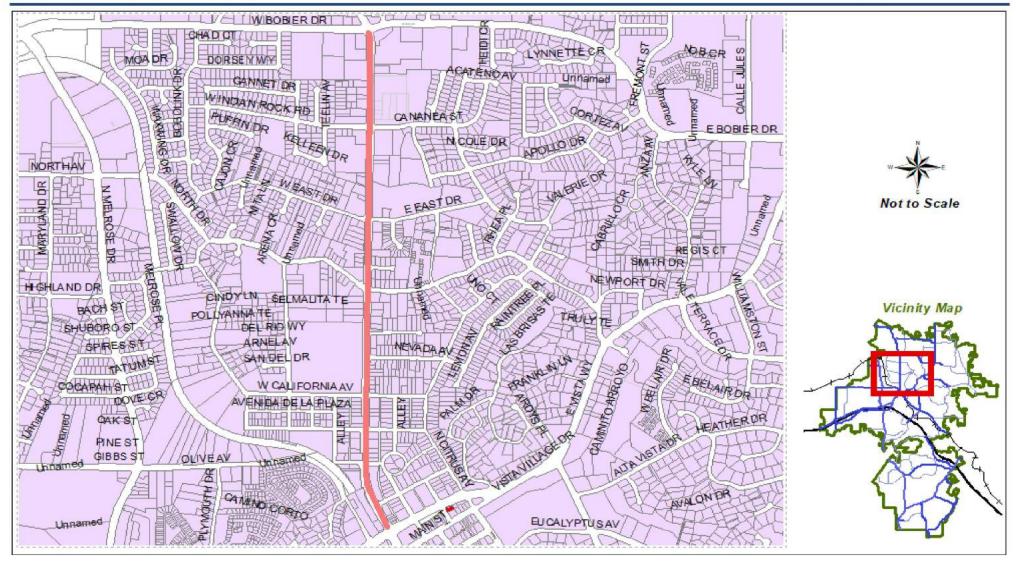

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DESCRIPTION

N. Santa Fe Avenue serves as a major active transportation connector for the Townsite neighborhood. The Townsite Complete Streets Project will implement pedestrian crossing improvements on this street. Two other projects will add green bike lanes and protected bike lanes. This project will implement additional improvements such as street trees and a pedestrian traffic signal at Washington Street.

STATUS

Staff will have design plans completed by one of the City's as-needed professional consultant. This will be followed by soliciting bids for project construction.

IMPACT ON OPERATING BUDGET

Approximately \$70,000 in recurring maintenance and street sweeping.

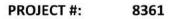

DESCRIPTION

Speeding is a major concern for City residents and the implementation of traffic calming is a priority for the City Council. This project will provide a funding source to develop traffic calming concepts and cost estimates for streets of concern. The streets will be prioritized and improvements will be implemented as funding becomes available. Traffic calming for a certain street is assessed using established City policies, and the techniques include signing and striping, speed humps, curb pop-outs, chicanes, traffic circles, raised medians and others.

STATUS

The City Council approved the installation of speed humps on six priority streets, which are Alta Vista Drive between Vale Terrace Place & Coventry Road, Eucalyptus Avenue between Alestar Street & Alta Vista Drive, Grapevine Lane, Highland Drive, Vale View Drive and Jim Porter Parkway at Brengle Terrace Park.

DESCRIPTION

Bicycling can be a clean and convenient alternative mode of transportation, which helps to alleviate motor vehicle congestion and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. However, existing bicycle facilities are often in need of improvements and gaps in the bicycle network prevent connectivity. Enhancing the existing bicycle network and facilities serves to accommodate the varying levels of user skills and to make bicycling a viable transportation option. Working towards this goal, the City Council approved the implementation of protected bike lanes on the City's major roads where street width allows for a striped buffer between the bicycle lane and motor vehicle travel lane. Raised flexible delineators are installed in the striped buffer to separate the bike lane from the travel lane.

STATUS

Staff will have design plans completed by one of the City's as-needed professional consultant. This will be followed by soliciting bids for project construction.

Approximately \$70,000 in recurring maintenance and street sweeping.
