Community Improvement Projects Update: A Year of Enhancements Ahead

The City of Vista is embarking on several community improvement projects to enhance infrastructure, public safety, and residents' overall quality of life. As we approach the end of 2024, here's an update on what's happening across the city, including street improvements, storm drain replacements, and new public amenities.

Slurry Seal / Street Rehabilitation Project

The slurry seal and street rehabilitation project is ongoing and nearing completion. Construction is expected to wrap up by the end of January 2025.

Bobolink Storm Drain Project

Construction on this project will begin on November 4, 2024, and is anticipated to be completed by the end of August 2025. This vital project will improve stormwater drainage and reduce the risk of flooding in the area.

Roundabout Projects: Foothill Drive/Oak Drive and Bobier Drive/Calle Jules

Two major intersections will transform with the installation of roundabouts starting on October 7, 2024. The roundabouts will help ease traffic flow and improve safety. Both roundabouts are scheduled to be completed by the end of March 2025.

Sheriff Substation Remodel

The remodel at 986 Vista Village Drive is underway and will be completed by the end of February 2025. The project ensures that the City's law enforcement continues to operate in a modernized and efficient environment.

Townsite Complete Streets Project

Enhancements under the Townsite Complete Streets project are in full swing. Designed to improve pedestrian and cyclist safety, the project is expected to be finished by the end of November 2024.

Nevada Avenue / Lemon Avenue Sidewalks and Lighting Project

This project will start on January 6, 2025, and is expected to be completed by September 2025. It will bring much-needed sidewalks and improved lighting to these residential areas.

Michigan Avenue Parking Lot Sidewalk

Construction has commenced on the Michigan Avenue parking lot sidewalk, improving pedestrian access. The estimated completion is November 2024.

Protected Bike Lanes and Green Bike Lane Projects

Cyclists in Vista can expect the construction of protected bike lanes and green bike lane markings to start in November 2024 and wrap up by February 2025.

Citywide CMP Storm Drain Replacement Project

This long-term project addresses aging infrastructure by replacing storm drains citywide. Construction is ongoing and expected to continue through November 2025.

Civic Center Solar Project

The Civic Center public parking lot on Alta Vista Drive will be closed from October 7, 2024, to March 2025 to install solar panels that will provide electricity to the Civic Center, resulting in significant cost savings.

Asphalt Speed Bump Project

Asphalt speed bumps are installed as needed, pending City Council approval for each location. They aim to calm traffic and increase neighborhood safety.

The City of Vista appreciates residents' patience as we work through these various projects to make our city an even better place to live.

Get Ready to Vote: Vista Residents Prepare for the November 5 Election

The Presidential General Election is just around the corner, and Vista residents are encouraged to ensure they're ready to cast their ballots. In addition to voting for the next President, Vista residents will vote in two City Council races with elections in Districts 2 and 3. To locate your district, visit vista.gov/districts.

With important decisions approaching, it is crucial to make sure your voter registration is up to date.

Start by verifying your political party preference and home address and, if necessary, updating your mailing address. If you need to make changes, complete a new voter registration online.

Under California's Voter's Choice Act, every active registered voter in San Diego County will receive a ballot in the mail during the week of October 6, 2024. Here are the options for casting your vote:

Mail It

Once you receive your ballot, you can vote from the comfort of your home and return it by mail through the U.S. Postal Service. Remember, your signature on the return envelope is required for your vote to count!

Drop It

Starting Tuesday, October 8, 2024, you can drop off your completed ballot at any official ballot drop box throughout San Diego County, including locations in Vista.

Visit

For those who prefer to vote in person, early voting starts Monday, October 7, at

the Registrar's office, which is open Monday through Friday from 8 am to 5 pm. Early voting expands starting Saturday, October 26, with select vote centers opening daily for in-person voting from 8 am to 5 pm.

Over 200 vote centers will be open across the county by Saturday, November 2, giving voters plenty of options to avoid long lines on Election Day. All vote centers, official ballot drop boxes, and the Registrar's office will be open from 7 am to 8 pm on Tuesday, November 5.

Make sure your voice is heard! Vista residents are encouraged to vote and participate in this important election, whether you mail it, drop it off, or visit in person. For more details, visit sdvote.com.



Fire Department Enhances Public Safety with New Life-Saving Vehicles



The Vista Fire Department has taken a significant step toward enhancing public safety with the addition of several new vehicles to its fleet. These new vehicles are designed to support the department's mission of providing advanced fire protection and emergency medical services to the growing Vista community.

The newly acquired apparatus includes four fire engines tailored explicitly for structural firefighting and paramedic response. These engines are equipped with the latest technology to ensure swift and efficient fire suppression while providing critical medical aid on-site. Additionally, the department has purchased a specialized fire engine for handling smaller fires and mop-up operations and an engine designed for wildland firefighting. This acquisition comes just in

time for California's wildfire season, further strengthening the department's capabilities in protecting homes and natural landscapes in the region.

To bolster emergency medical services, the Vista Fire Department has also added a state-of-the-art paramedic ambulance. The advanced equipment in this vehicle will help firefighters, paramedics, and EMTs to deliver life-saving care to residents during medical emergencies.

Vista Fire Chief Gerard Washington expressed his enthusiasm about the department's new additions, highlighting the City of Vista's dedication to public safety.

"The City of Vista is deeply committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of our community," said Chief Washington. "By equipping our firefighter/paramedics and EMTs with the latest technology and tools, we are better prepared to respond to various emergencies. New to San Diego County, the Genasys Protect app adds another layer of safety and communication during emergencies. This cutting-edge tool uses advanced geo-targeted alerts to provide customized notifications based on your location. Whether you need to be aware of a wildfire in your area or a potential

evacuation zone, Genasys Protect ensures you receive timely and accurate information directly on your smartphone.

Both apps offer life-saving features, including detailed evacuation routes, emergency shelter locations, and real-time notifications from local emergency services.

How to Prepare for Disasters

- 1). **Download Ready San Diego and Genasys Protect:** Ensure your family has these apps installed on all smartphones and tablets.
- 2). **Create an Emergency Plan:** Discuss evacuation routes, communication methods, and meeting points with your household. Make sure everyone knows what to do in an emergency.
- 3). **Assemble an Emergency Kit:** Stock up on essential supplies, including water, food, medications, flashlights, and batteries, so you're ready to act quickly.
- 4.) **Stay Informed:** Monitor the apps for real-time updates and critical alerts to help you stay safe.

Keep Fats, Oils, and Grease Out of Sinks to Prevent Clogged Drains

The City is reminding residents to take simple steps to prevent costly plumbing problems and protect the environment by properly disposing of fats, oils, and grease (FOG). When these substances are poured down drains, they can solidify and cause blockages in household plumbing and the City's sewer system.

FOG can come from everyday cooking—like bacon grease, butter, oil from frying, or food scraps. Instead of pouring these items down the drain, residents are encouraged to collect FOG in a container and dispose of it in the trash once it cools.



Here's how residents can help:

- Avoid pouring greasy or oily liquids down the sink or garbage disposal.
- Before washing dishes, scrape off food scraps or wipe them with a paper towel and dispose of them in the trash.
- Pour grease and oil into a can, let it cool, and then dispose in the trash.
- Use paper towels, kitty litter, or coffee grounds to absorb oil spills.

By keeping FOG out of drains, Vista residents can help prevent sewer backups, protect local waterways, and maintain a healthy, functional plumbing system.

Are you ready for rain?

Help keep pollutants out of rainwater that flows to our local creeks:

- Pick up pet waste or loose trash and debris.
- Avoid applying pesticides and fertilizers prior to rainfall.
- Maintain vehicles to prevent oil and anti-freeze leaks.
- Inspect roof gutters and area drains, remove debris as needed.
- Wait 48 hours after rainfall to irrigate.
- Install plants or mulch on exposed soil to prevent erosion.

City Offers Free ADU Plans for Homeowners

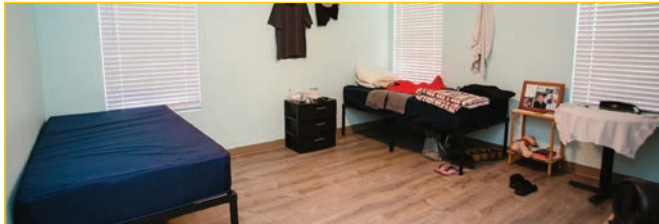


The City of Vista is making it easier than ever for residents to add an Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU), also known as a "second unit" or "granny flat," to their properties. These additional living spaces can be

attached or detached from the main residence and they provide full independent living amenities, including a kitchen, bathroom, and sleeping area. An ADU can be created as new construction, by converting part of your home, or by repurposing an existing structure. Additionally, the City now offers 10 free, pre-approved ADU plans that can be used to construct a new detached ADU. With this option, plan check fees are waived, though permit and inspection fees still apply.

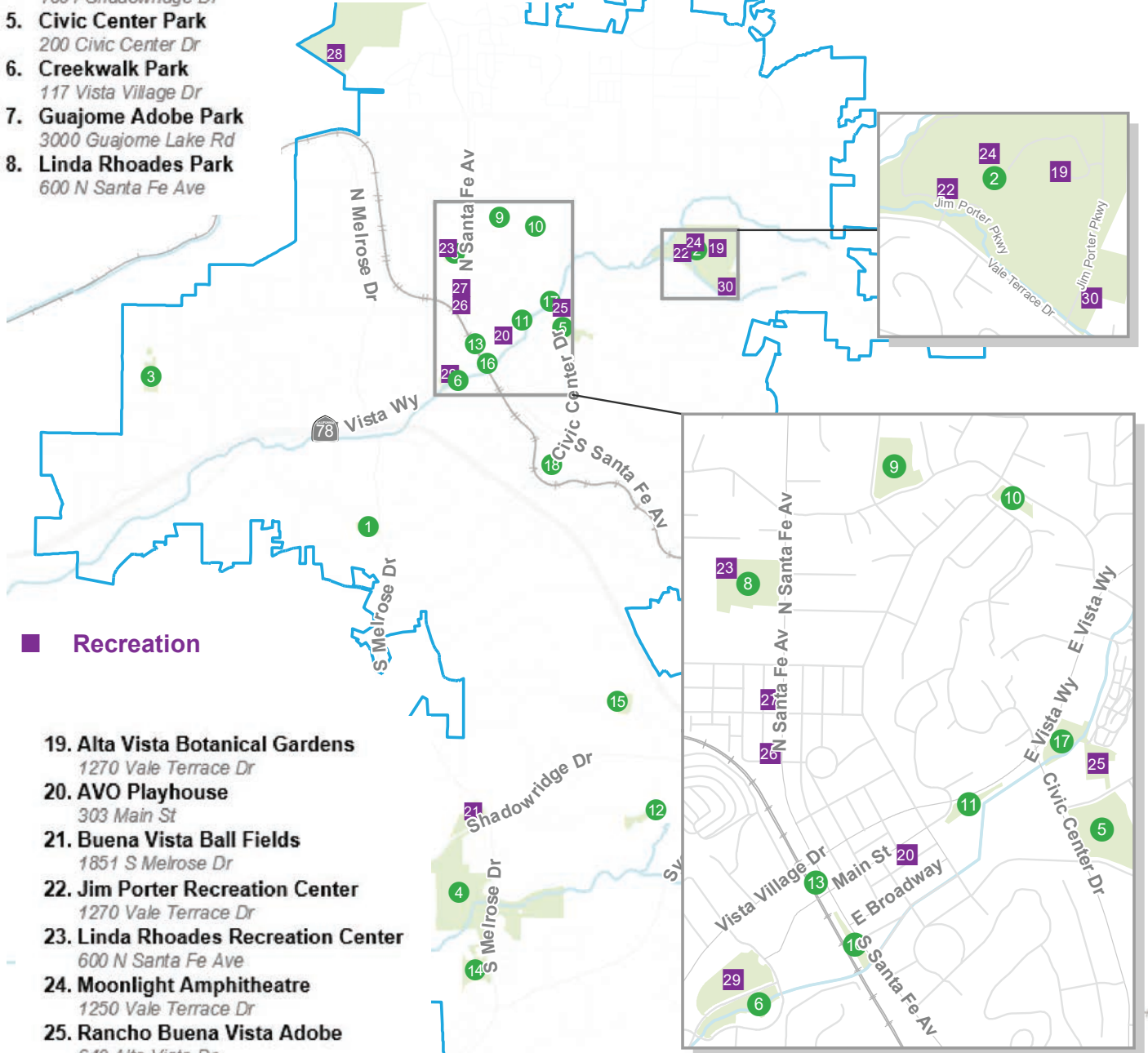
